
















February 2010 BOM - Snail's Trail Block - 8 1/2" Block unfinished


Fabrics:	Patch	Cutting Instructions	Sub-Cutting Instruction
Colour 1 	A	2 @ 1 1/2" x 1 1/2"	
Colour 2 	A	2 @ 1 1/2" x 1 1/2"	
Colour 1 	B	1 @ 3 1/4" x 3 1/4"	Sub-cut on both diagonals 
Colour 2 	B	1 @ 3 1/4" x 3 1/4"	Sub-cut on both diagonals
Colour 1 	C	1 @ 2 7/8" x 2 7/8"	Sub-cut on one diagonal 
Colour 2 	C	1 @ 2 7/8" x 2 7/8"	Sub-cut on one diagonal
Colour 1 	D	1 @ 5 1/4" x 5 1/4"	Sub-cut on both diagonals 
Colour 2 	D	1 @ 5 1/4" x 5 1/4"	Sub-cut on both diagonals
Colour 1 	E	1 @ 4 7/8" x 4 7/8"	Sub-cut on one diagonal 
Colour 2 	E	1 @ 4 7/8" x 4 7/8"	Sub-cut on one diagonal


The Snail's Trail Block is a simple block. You will construct it by sewing blocks and triangles together using *2 jewel tone fabrics: please use a pink jewel tone for Colour 1; please use either a purple, blue or blue/green jewel tone for Colour 2.* You will start with a 4-patch centre unit. The triangles are then added alternately to opposite sides around the centre unit. Special attention to layout, centering the triangles on the unit it is being sewn to, and making sure your points are sewn accurately, are the only tricks. All seams are to be sewn using 1/4" seams allowance.

Instructions:

1. Make a 4-patch unit by sewing the four Patch A squares together, placing like colours diagonally from each other. 

2. Fold triangles in half to find the midpoint along their longest edge, finger press. 

3. Sew Colour 1 Patch B triangle to opposite sides of the 4-patch centre unit, orienting it as shown, being careful to centre long edge of triangle on centre of 4-patch unit. Press seam allowances toward the triangles. 

4. Sew Colour 2 Patch B triangle to opposite sides of unit made in step 3, orienting it as shown, being careful to centre long edge of triangle on centre of 4-patch unit. Press seam allowances toward the triangles. 

5. Continue adding triangles in pairs around the block, working from Patch C to Patch D to Patch E triangles, and referring to diagram for placement.

6. Your block should measure 8 1/2" x 8 1/2" square.
