






September 2010 BOM – Card Trick – 12 ½ x 12 ½” Block, unfinished

You will construct this block using 4 vibrant colours and a white background. Please select bright colours.

Fabrics:		Fabric Required
Red		One 4 7/8” square One 5 1/4” square
Pink		One 4 7/8” square One 5 1/4” square
Orange		One 4 7/8” square One 5 1/4” square
Yellow		One 4 7/8” square One 5 1/4” square
White		Two 4 7/8” squares One 5 1/4” square

Instructions:

From the white background cut the following:

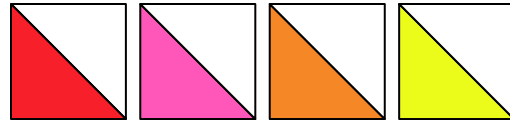
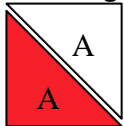
- Sub cut diagonally the two 4 7/8” squares, resulting in four half square triangles. These will be called White Triangle A.
- Sub cut on both diagonals all the 5 1/4” square, resulting in four quarter square triangles. These will be called White Triangle B.

From each of FOUR different colours (red, pink, orange, and yellow) cut the following:

- Sub cut diagonally the one 4 7/8” squares, resulting in two half square triangles. These will be called Colour Triangle A.
- Sub cut on both diagonals the one 5 1/4” square, resulting in four quarter square triangles. These will be called Colour Triangle B.

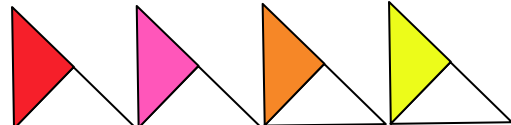
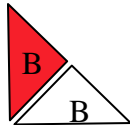
Piecing the Units: use 1/4” seam allowances

- Make Pieced-Square Unit 1 as follows: Sew one White Triangle A to one Colour Triangle A. Make one Pieced-Square Unit 1 for each of four different colours, pressing seams to the white triangle.



Make 1 of each colour combination

- Make Pieced-Half Square Triangle Unit 2 as follows: Sew one White Triangle B to one Colour Triangle B. Make one Pieced-Triangle Unit 2 for each of four different colours, pressing seam to the colour triangle.



Make 1 of each colour combination

- Sew Colour Triangle A to each Pieced-Triangle Unit 2, using the following diagram as the fabric combination. Refer to this unit as Unit 3. Press seam allowance toward the larger Triangle A.

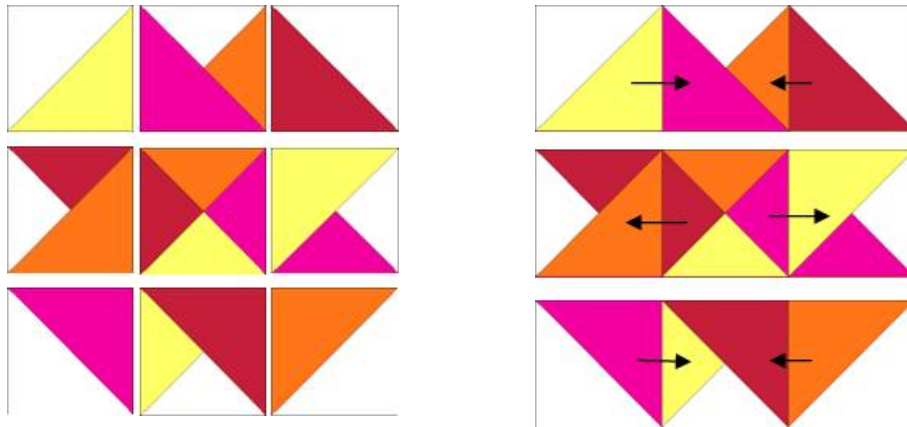


8. Make the Centre Unit 4 by sewing one of each four Colour Triangle B's, refer to the following diagram for placement. Press inner seams in alternate directions so they butt together when sewing the centre seam.



Assembling the Block:

9. Using the following assembly diagram as a guide, piece Units together to make rows. Press top and bottom row seams to the inside. Press the middle row seams to the outside. This will ensure that seams will butt together nicely when sewing the rows together. Finally, sew the rows together. Press seams. Your block will measure 12 1/2 x 12 1/2", unfinished.



Note: you will have 2 Colour Triangle B's left over for each colour.
